May 1 - An IMPORTANT Deadline Date!!!

There are many important dates in the 4-H calendar year, but **May 1** is one of the busiest!! A very important deadline in 4-H is the **ADD/DROP project deadline**. Have you decided that a 4-H project is simply not working out or that you have found something new you would like to try??? **May 1** is the last point in which you can officially add or drop a project from your 4-H enrollment for the year. Remember, this is PROJECT ENROLLMENT, not what you plan to enter for fair. You can be enrolled in a project and not take anything related to that project to the fair, that's okay!

To ADD or DROP a project, all you need to do is to log back into your 4HOnline account and make the changes yourself! If you are having problems adding or dropping a project, simply reach out to your local Extension office and staff will assist in making changes to your 4HOnline account.

May 1 is the deadline for **new members to be enrolled** to participate in your county fair this summer. Keep in mind, a 4-H project record should be completed on each project you are enrolled in and that you can only enter 4-H classes at the fair related to project that you are enrolled in!

May 1 is also the deadline date for **KSF/KJLS Market Beef nomination**. A future deadline to turn in **horse identification certificates** is **June 1**.

April 2025

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K-State Animal Science Leadership Academy (KASLA) 2025

Applications are now open for the 2025 K-State Animal Science Leadership Academy. The goal of this academy is to further develop young leaders within the livestock industry and prepare them for a successful future in this field. In 2025, the program will be held from **June 11-14**. Applications can be found at <https://www.asi.ksu.edu/KASLA> and are due by **April 15, 2025**.

The four-day session focuses on increasing participants knowledge of Kansas' diverse livestock industry, as well as building their leadership skills. Twenty high school students will be selected to participate based on their educational, community, and agricultural involvement, as reflected in the application process.

The program's itinerary will feature interactive workshops, tours, and faculty mentorship with ASI professors. Industry leaders will also join the participants frequently to share their knowledge and expertise. Throughout the week, participants will work in teams to evaluate current events within the animal science industry and educate others. This experience will culminate in a closing reception on Saturday morning.

Participants will stay on campus in university housing with program staff. Transportation to and from the event is the responsibility of the participant, along with a \$50 fee to reserve their space. The fee is only due upon acceptance and not at the time of application. The Livestock and Meat Industry Council (LMIC) generously provides all other sponsorships.

Hosted by the K-State Department of Animal Sciences and Industry and sponsored by LMIC, the academy's goal is to develop young leaders within the livestock industry and prepare them for a successful future in this field.

State Livestock Nomination Information

It is imperative that you plan ahead if you plan to take livestock to the State Fair or KJLS. This is an online based nomination process that is multiple steps!

1. Purchase official DNA envelopes through ShoWorks at <https://kansasnom.fairwire.com/>. DNA Envelopes prior to 2021 **WILL NOT** be accepted. These must be ordered ten days prior to the respective nomination deadline.
 - **April 20** – Market Beef
 - **June 5** – Small Livestock—market swine, commercial gilts, market lambs, commercial ewes, breeding and market goats
2. Enter animal and exhibitor data through online system by nomination deadline.
 - **May 1** - Market Beef
 - **June 15** - Small Livestock—market swine, commercial gilts, market lambs, commercial ewes, breeding and market goats
3. Mail completed DNA envelopes and copy of online submission receipt by nomination deadline. It is preferred that these are sent via certified mail, so there is a receipt.
4. Online approval by extension agents (4-H) and FFA advisors (FFA)

It should be noted that a completed animal nomination DOES NOT constitute a completed entry into the State Fair or KJLS! Nominations make market animals or commercial breeding females eligible to be entered and shown in the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or KJLS. After completing the nomination process, exhibitors must submit show entries, and pay the affiliated entry fees, directly through each show's entry link by the entry deadline to participate.

YQCA Instructions

Hopefully, everyone is familiar with YQCA certification by now! As a quick reminder, youth showing any food animal that is exhibited at the Meadowlark District Fairs, Kansas State Fair and KJLS are required to complete YQCA annually. If you were not able to attend one of the three training sessions offered, you are welcome to go to another county/district or take the training or do web-based training at your leisure. To date there has not been enough interest to have another District in-person training, so please reach out to Ross ASAP if this is of interest to your family! If there is not enough interest, web-based training will be the most logical option.

You must send your certificate to Ross at rmostell@ksu.edu to complete this certification process. If this step is not done before **July 1**, the youth will be ineligible to sell their animal in the premium auction at the fair. - Provide an opportunity for youth to experience the K-State campus and its wealth of resources.
- Develop college and career readiness skills which prepare participants academically and socially for a successful transition to college and life as an adult.

New District 4-H Policy Addresses Overnight Stay at Locally Organized 4-H Events

After concerns were voiced about the need to clarify and give direction to overnight stay of 4-H Youth at locally organized 4-H events a policy statement was drafted to ensure the safety and well-being of both youth and adults involved in any locally led or organized club, district, regional or statewide 4-H event in the Meadowlark District where adults are housed with (or nearby) youth or where youth and unrelated adults share bathrooms.

This policy will apply to any locally led or organized club, district, regional or statewide educational opportunity that will use funds raised by a local 4-H club or group in the name of 4-H that supports travel or registration expenses for their 4-Hers, their families or volunteers to attend the event or similar events.

Examples of locally coordinated or sponsored events may include but are not limited to the following:

- Youth—workshops, events, fairs, lock-ins and camps or campouts
- Sporting competitions
- Overnight junior leader or ambassador events
- Travel and events held during 4-H Exchange trips
- Travel to competitions such as judging contests with volunteers, coaches or district staff

Ensuring Excellence: The Role of Properly Trained and Certified Kansas 4-H Leaders

Dedicated volunteers who serve as Community Club and Project Leaders. These individuals play a pivotal role in guiding and mentoring youth, ensuring that every 4-H member benefits from a safe, educational, and positive experience. To uphold the integrity and effectiveness of the program, all Kansas 4-H leaders must be properly trained through the Volunteer Information Profile and Risk Committee (VIPRC) process and adhere to the 4-H Leaders Code of Conduct.

Adhering to the 4-H Leaders Code of Conduct

In addition to training and certification, Kansas 4-H leaders are expected to uphold the 4-H Leaders Code of Conduct, which serves as a foundation for ethical and responsible leadership. The Code of Conduct outlines key expectations for behavior, including:

- **Ensuring a Safe and Inclusive Environment:** Leaders must create a welcoming atmosphere free from discrimination, bullying, and harassment. All youth, regardless of background, should have equal opportunities to participate and grow within the program.
- **Exemplifying Integrity and Respect:** Leaders are role models for 4-H members and should conduct themselves with honesty, respect, and fairness. They must foster a culture of trust and collaboration within their clubs and projects.
- **Prioritizing Positive Youth Development:** The primary goal of 4-H leadership is to nurture the potential of young people. Leaders should focus on encouraging personal growth, skill-building, and character development through constructive and engaging activities.
- **Following Policies and Procedures:** To maintain the integrity of Kansas 4-H programs, leaders must adhere to established guidelines, including those related to child safety, program delivery, and financial stewardship.

The Impact of Well-Trained Leaders

Youth benefit from positive mentorship, structured learning experiences, and a sense of belonging within their communities. Parents gain confidence in the program, knowing their children are in the hands of responsible and capable leaders.

Swine Tagging

New this year is centralized Swine Tagging. It will be held **Sunday, May 4 from 2:00-4:00 PM** at the Northeast Kansas Heritage Complex. This is only for tagging. We will **NOT** be weighing any swine. We will have you drive through the building like we do at fair time. Then either a swine superintendent or someone from your family will enter the trailer to tag the swine. There will be **NO** unloading of any swine for any reason.

Jackson County Spring Livestock Show

The livestock show will be on **May 24** out at the NE Kansas Heritage Complex. Be watching for flyer and the entry form.

Livestock Premium Auction Requirements

If you plan to sell an animal through the fair auction, make sure you are reviewing the Auction Requirement form periodically to make sure you qualify. These forms will need to be turned in by **July 1**.

- There will be no flooring of under or over-weight animals. The 4-Her must make their own arrangements with these animals.

Volunteer Screening

Any Club Leaders, Project Leaders, and other adult volunteers in direct contact with youth will need to fill out a profile in 4HOnline and complete training if they haven't done so. Wednesday, April 23, from **6:00–8:00 PM** at Valley Falls Fairgrounds: Market lambs and meat goats must be weighed in to enter the Jefferson County Fair and livestock sale. ID forms available at weigh-in or online on webpage by **April 1**. Tags are **\$3.00** weigh-in.

Be sure to enroll project(s) in 4hOnline before weigh-in.

NOTE: The minimum sale weight for market goats has changed! Market goats must now weigh **at least 50 lbs.** to be sold in the ring.

Swine Tags

There are two swine central tagging events scheduled at the fairgrounds. The first one is **Wednesday, April 23** from **6:00-8:00 PM**; the second event is **Saturday, April 26** from **8:30-11:00 AM**. Swine paperwork and tags will be available at the tagging events. Tags are **\$3.00** each. Swine will be tagged in trailers; they will not be unloaded. Tags are **NOT** available over-the-counter per State 4-H rule.
