others as active members of society. Youth will engage in educational activities to explore, practice and master civic engagement skills and personal development to make a difference in their community, country and world.

Kansas 4-H Record Book Refresher

It's never too soon to start working on your 4-H record books! You will be most successful if you work on them consistently throughout the year, a little bit at a time. ZBooks within ZSuite is an electronic record-keeping option available statewide. Both the Project Record Reports and the Kansas Permanent Record are part of ZBooks.

All the information you need to get started can be found at: https://www.meadowlark.k-state.edu/4-h/ project_records.html. PLEASE USE ONLY THESE LINKS AND ALWAYS REFERENCE THE MEADOWLARK DISTRICT WEBSITE FOR ALL FORMS. Be sure to review the "Guide to Kansas 4-H Project Recognition" and the "MED 4-H Record Book Tips," which are available on the page linked above.

Setting goals is a great place to start. The goal-setting guide, available at www.bookstore.ksre.ksu.edu/
pubs/4H1100.pdf, can help you set meaningful goals within your project work. Keep these tips in mind as you begin your record book for the year!

- All PDF and Word forms must be downloaded and saved to your computer, drive, or device if you
 want to edit, save, print later, or use them throughout the year.
- If you do not have the latest version of Adobe Reader, you **will** experience issues. Please follow the instructions on our website for installing the current version.
- The Personal Information Page linked on our website is the **only** version that will be accepted. If you have older versions saved, please replace them with this form-fill PDF.
- The Permanent Record has had some minor formatting updates. We encourage you to use the version dated 2020. (The Permanent Record is also available in ZBooks.).
- Only Project Report forms from our website or ZSuite will be accepted. **Please note:** There are three age divisions—use the one that matches your 4-H age on January 1, 2026.
- There are also two types of reports: one for animal projects and one for all other project areas. If you are unsure which report to use, **please ask!**
- Whether using ZBooks or PDF forms, the number of submission "spots" on the Project Report pages
 is fixed. If you have more information than fits in a section, summarize it in a format that works best
 for you, as these reports do not expand. ZBooks allows unlimited entries, but only a fixed number
 can be included in the final Record Book.
- Working or scratch copies are always helpful, especially if you update records throughout the year. If you need printed copies of any forms, we can provide them upon request.

4-H Club Goals and Area Record Books Due

Completed club goals for the 2025-2026 4-H year are due in your county's Extension office by **January 2** at **4:30 PM**. The form can be found on the Meadowlark District website at https://www.meadowlark.k-state.edu/4-h/club resources.html .

Also due on this day are Record Reports for youth heading to the NE Regional Screening. Youth eligible to submit at this level should have received correspondence at or after the 4-H Achievement Events in November.

SAVE THE DATE: Citizenship in Action (CIA)

Citizenship in Action will be held in **Topeka** on **February 15–16**, **2026**, for youth ages 13—18 as of January 1 of the current year. This is a two-day event, sponsored by the State 4-H Youth Leadership Council. The purpose of the event helps Kansas youth learn about the state legislative process and how their voice can impact their communities. Watch your email for registration information!
