What is 4-H?

4-H is a national youth development program that creates confident, capable, and responsible individuals who are Beyond Ready for their future. Through program areas like agriculture, science, leadership, and community service, 4-H teaches practical skills while encouraging curiosity and personal growth.

Who can be in 4-H?

Youth ages 7 to 18 on January 1 of the current 4-H year are invited to join. And, it's not just for country kids! Individuals from every background benefit from 4-H programming.

<u>Cloverbuds</u> is a free, educational program designed as a precursor to the 4-H program. Youth ages 5 to 6 on January 1 of the current 4-H year may participate.

Why should my family join?

4-H equips youth with essential life skills and delivers unforgettable experiences and lasting friendships along the way.

Members develop leadership, communication, and problemsolving skills in a fun, supportive environment. Whether raising animals, giving presentations, or leading service projects, 4-Hers learn by doing and gain confidence. Opportunities abound for civic engagement, scholarships, and, eventually, careers.

How can I join?

The 4-H year begins October 1, as does enrollment through 4-H Online. New families may join at any point through the year while returning families should complete re-enrollment by November 1.

Project-based learning is central to the 4-H concept.
